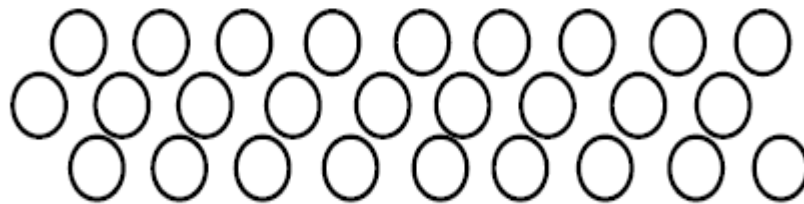

HOUSTON (Aug. 20, 2020) – In response to the changing meetings and event landscape, Houston First Corporation (HFC) announces the opening of [The Avenida Houston Virtual Studio](#), a permanent broadcast facility with several new innovative solutions (details below) that is capable of hosting both virtual and hybrid events.

AVENIDA HOUSTON VIRTUAL STUDIO CAPABILITIES

The new 5,250 square-foot permanent studio will provide event planners with more flexibility when hosting virtual, in-person, or hybrid meetings. The studio enables event organizers to incorporate any number of presenters, with or without an audience. Individual presenters can be integrated from any location, and small groups, like panelists or audiences, can be included from a studio location or multiple live locations. Our capabilities are accessible to online, direct feed, and satellite broadcast modalities.

Unlike other traditional broadcast studios, HFC’s capable sales and services team can support all event needs from standalone studio support to full event support including; IT, hotel bookings, food and beverage service, airport transfers for speakers, parking, and more.

The virtual studio is just the beginning of HFC’s efforts to respond to the challenges of COVID-19 on in-person meetings and events. Recognizing that health and safety will continue to be a critical need as we approach a new normal post-pandemic, the HFC team has launched several initiatives:

INTEGRATED VIRAL PROTECTION (IVP)

In early September, the George R. Brown Convention Center (GRB) will be the first convention center in the country to deploy the Integrated Viral Protection (IVP) system, which will include three mobile units in the studio. This initiative is in partnership with Monzer Hourani, inventor and founder of IVP and CEO of Medistar Corporation. Houston-based IVP made international news in early July when it introduced the world’s first biodefense filtration technology proven to eliminate SARS-CoV-2 (99.999%), anthrax spores (99.8%) and other airborne contaminants through a heated filter without impacting the temperature of the ambient air.

“The pandemic has created a number of challenges, but the Houston First team is committed to finding opportunities for safe and functional solutions that will lead the city and the hospitality industry into recovery,” said Michael Heckman, acting president and CEO of Houston First Corporation. “Discovering new technology, new possibilities, and new partnerships will not only keep our community safe but allow our economy to rebound.”

Houstonfirst Has a Solution for Meetings

“We are excited to partner with Houston First and deploy this one and only technology proven to eliminate airborne COVID-19 instantaneously. The invention by Monzer Hourani and the breakthrough research conducted by the Superconductivity Center of Texas at The University of Houston, Galveston National Laboratory at UTMB and Texas A&M Engineering and Experiment Station is a public health gamechanger and will offer a sense of security to breathe with confidence indoors,” said Dr. Garrett Peel, principal at IVP.”

The research has been collaborated and endorsed by scientists at Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Argonne National Laboratory and will be deployed in the coming weeks to schools in Texas, Florida, and Arizona as well as in an international hotel/resort chain, university student housing, and national entertainment/hospitality venues.

“The time for action is now, and helping our hometown reopen in record timing with this proven COVID-19 killing science is so important to me as we use Houston-based research to help lead us out of this crisis and get us back to business,” said Monzer Hourani, inventor and founder of IVP.

THERMAL SCANNING

Houston First recently installed thermal scanners at all 15 entrances of the GRB Convention Center. An additional 15 devices will be installed at entrances across the remaining [HFC-owned facilities](#).

The NUCTECH infrared face temperature screening system FeverBlock provides a non-contact solution for large scene temperature measurement and screening. The device can locate the face and avoid interference from unrelated high-temperature objects, using a combination of infrared thermal imaging technology and visible light imaging technology. The system will automatically alert if abnormal body temperature is detected.

ELECTROSTATIC SPRAYING

Electrostatic sprayers can clean up to 54,000 square feet of surface area per hour, reducing labor and chemical resources. The GRB now has 20 EMist 360 electrostatic disinfectant sprayers, which will be used at the end of each day to sanitize all common areas throughout the GRB as well as meeting rooms used during events. An additional eight sprayers will be available for use in HFC-owned venues in the theater district.

HOUSTON CLEAN PLEDGE

Earlier this month, Houston launched [‘Houston Clean’](#), a city-wide safety initiative, in partnership with hospitality industry partners. Protecting visitors, residents, and employees is a top priority. This initiative allows visitors to explore Houston with confidence, not just within HFC’s facilities but also while visiting area hotels, events, and attractions. HFC has taken this pledge and will continue to find innovative ways to provide a safe and healthy space for visitors.

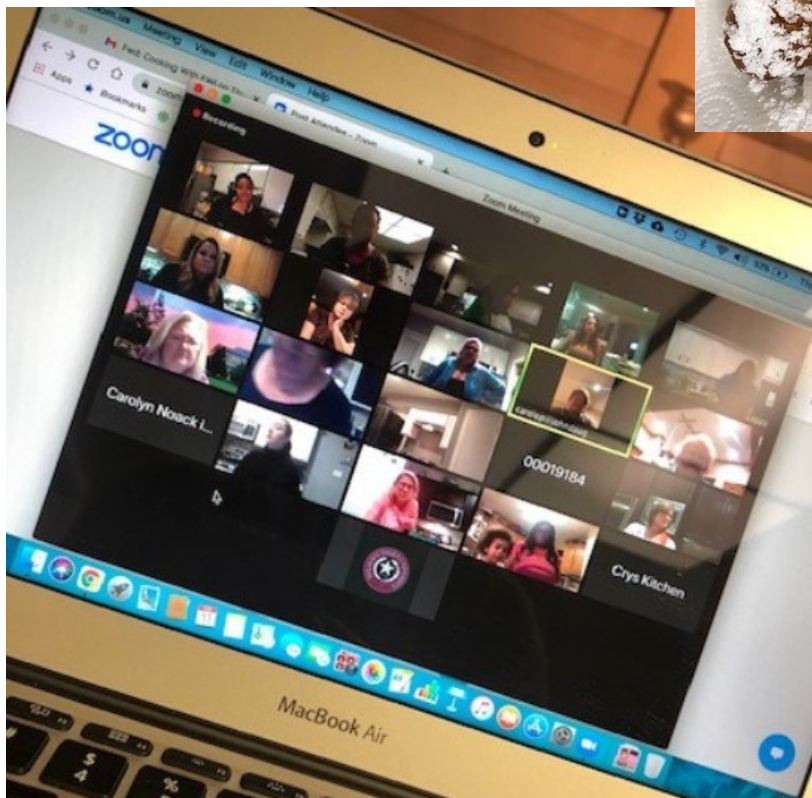


FEBRUARY MEETING RECAP

7 Ways to Spring Clean Your Career

I love spring!

It's my birthday season, I love my cute, pink, spring jacket, and I can feel and see nature blooming all around me. I also love any opportunity to get organized, tidy things up, and get both my physical space and my mind fresh and clean. And I don't think I'm alone!

Spring is a time during which many of us reset priorities, check in on things, and start thinking about the next quarter of the year. Spring is a natural moment to reevaluate, check in, and get your career in order. Here are a few things that are always helpful when emerging from your winter hibernation with respect to your career:

1. Clean Your Space

Your perception of your productivity may be negatively affected by clutter and disorganization. In an [OfficeMax 2011 study](#), 90% of Americans admit that clutter negatively impacts their productivity, as well as their state of mind, motivation, and happiness.

Clean off the desk, grab some Lysol wipes, and make it fun with some new fancy pens or colorful wall calendar. You may also consider getting a plant or something green. [Studies](#) of several European offices have concluded that adding some plant life to your workspace can increase productivity by up to 15%.

2. First Quarter Review

We're almost done with the first quarter of the year. So ...

What were your big accomplishments?

Where are you on the goals you set for yourself?

Did you complete a big project?

Did you hit a new fundraising target?

Take a few minutes to jot these down in your work notebook so you don't forget.

Here's another idea: Create a new document to track your success stories and positive feedback. Every time you get a "great job on that project" email from your boss, or any good feedback from a colleague, paste that email into your running document so you'll have it accessible should you need to easily reference all of that recognition and good work.

3. Identify Your Gaps

Are there skills or knowledge areas you'd like to beef up? Are there things you can do to grow in those areas?

Now might be the time to look into that class or training that piqued your interest a few months back.

Have a conversation with your manager about where you want to grow over the next few months. If you work for a large organization there may even be opportunities for in-house professional development like the kind they offer at [Deloitte University](#) or [Girl Scout University](#) where you can take a conflict management or a mind-mapping course.

If you like your job but don't love it, putting yourself in a learning environment is often a great way to up your engagement and interest at work. Learning environments can lead to new ideas or projects to get involved in that could evolve into a different role or work stream you really enjoy.

4. Check in with Your Network

Spring is a great time to reach out to and check in with old references, bosses, and colleagues.

Every time you find yourself in the job market, you likely find yourself thinking, "Why didn't I reach out to these folks when I didn't need something, just to keep the relationship established?"

Well, now's your chance. Pick two or three people and shoot them an email. Ask how their work, family, or travel plans have been and they'll probably be happy to tell you all about it!

5. Grow Your Network

Growing your network is one of the most important and easy ways to make valuable connections, stay up to date on key happenings in your field, and increase future job prospects.

Take a few minutes to search for conferences, symposiums, and gatherings that might be of interest to you.

Don't know where to start? Google your field and add the word *conferences* or *networks* and you'll likely find information about upcoming gatherings that may be of interest.

Whole Whale, a New York based digital agency working to up the impact of nonprofits, has published a [seemingly exhaustive list](#) of nonprofit conferences scheduled for 2017. [Meetup.com](#) is also a great place to find happy hours where you're sure to meet others who share professional interests. And if you're considering graduate school, Idealist Grad Fairs are a must!

Hold the dates on your calendar and talk with peers, mentors, and your manager about what you and your organization might get from attending a particular event. It can be a win-win opportunity for you and your organization as your attendance could help increase brand recognition among peer organizations.

6. Do Some Reflection on What's Next

Whether you're happy in your job or searching for your next position, it's always a good idea to take some time to think about where you want to be or what you want to work toward over the next three-to-nine months.

What's working in your career? What's your biggest pain point? What would be the next ideal step?

When you identify what's working, you can put more energy into those parts of your work. When you know your pain point, you can figure out how to solve it. And if you're thinking about next steps, turn the reflection into tangible action items and milestones.

7. Plan your Next Vacation

Project: [Time Off 's 2016 report](#) revealed that since 2000, employee vacation day usage has dropped significantly, with 55% of workers claiming they had unused vacation days in 2015.

The most important step employees can take to ensure those vacation days get used is to plan their time in advance. The study shows that 51% of those who plan vacations in advance use all their days. 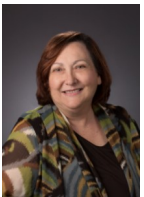
